Burundi		The WB has been working with the Government of Burundi and development partners since 2009 to support the nationwide programs on Free health care and results-based financing (RBF) in the country. The WB has an ongoing project to support RBF in the country with an increased focus on immunization thanks to GAVI's HSS funding, which is being channelled through the project. Given the fragility context of Burundi and the fiscal risk related to macroeconomic instability, insecurity and unpredictable external support to the health sector, the country needs to develop a health financing strategy to lay out the ground for increased domestic funding of these two main programs (free care and RBF) and sustainable funding of key public health programs (such as immunization) to ensure continuous access to quality health care services. Although work on the health financing strategy started 4 years ago, progress has been slow due to the 2015 crisis and the fact that most development partners stopped their support to the country. The preparation process of the strategy has to be revitalized which includes updating some of the analytical work that had been prepared as background to the strategy (e.g. equity analysis) and developing other background documents to facilitate evidence based planning. In this context, the team is proposing support to the country that will hopefully lead to a multi-year engagement, during which time the country will lead ultimately to the development and the implementation of the health financing strategy which will be developed in end 2018-2019. The first task will be to conduct a health financing system assessment (HFSA) with a drill-down assessment on equity, fiscal space and sustainability of externally financed disease programs, including a focus on immunization.
