# Training Component




- Site development for suspects and confirmed cases
- Patient and Staff circuit identification
- Hand wash station deployment,

- Training of doctors, nurses, hygienists, volonteers, red cross support
- Training of Fann Hospital Svces (CTCV, Pneumologie, ORL, Neurologie, Neurochirurgie, SAU, Psychiatrie, Bucco-dentaire, Administration, SH, HEAR, CHOM).

# What was done: Supervise and detect

### Contact tracing:





- 74 identified contacts
- Two visits daily for all contacts
- Home confinement contacts
- Contacts support (so they won't go out)
- 5 false alarms
- Psychological support (stress management)

**End of follow up period:** 

**Thursday, Septembre 18 2014** 

But according to WHO, Senegal was still in epidemic phase 'till October 9th



## 3 Borders Components




- Close borders (august-21-2014)
