

The AMC: accelerating equitable access

- **The AMC has one central goal:** *providing effective, safe vaccines for those who need them most, regardless of wealth, on the same urgent timeline*
-

- As vaccines move successfully through trials, it provides a unique opportunity to tackle the acute phase of the pandemic
- The AMC accelerates and reserves early doses to immunise 500m-1bn people, and makes doses affordable
- The AMC will kickstart the market and will be complemented by country cost sharing (supported by MDB financing) and doses donated by countries



First 1 billion doses delivered by end of 2021





85 requests for vaccine support received from AMC eligible countries




Illustrative Resource Mobilisation scenarios




= vaccine doses paid by donors



Gavi COVAX AMC Private Sector Contribution





Five principles for sharing doses with COVAX

1. **Safe and effective:** shared doses must be of assured quality, with approval by a stringent regulatory authority and/or WHO
2. **Early availability:** shared doses should be made available as early as possible
3. **Rapidly deployable:** doses should be shared as early as possible in the manufacturing process to speed deployment
4. **Flexibly deployable:** to facilitate equitable access, doses should not be earmarked for specific geographies or populations, in keeping with COVAX's allocation mechanism
5. **Substantive quantity:** shared doses should be of sufficient and predictable volumes to have a substantive impact in achieving the goals of the Facility

In keeping with the Facility's mission, principles, and operations, the Facility will ensure that shared doses are distributed effectively, and equitably through the COVAX Allocation Mechanism

The Campaign ahead: cascading moments to build up momentum



- Adjust plans after taking stock of the results achieved with Phase II
- Close coordination with the ACT-A platform
- Clear, consistent, and mutually reinforcing messaging
- Engage with key journalists and media outlets in targeted markets
- Publishing compelling digital content across multiple channels to enlisting influential champions to extend its public reach, including in AMC eligible countries.
