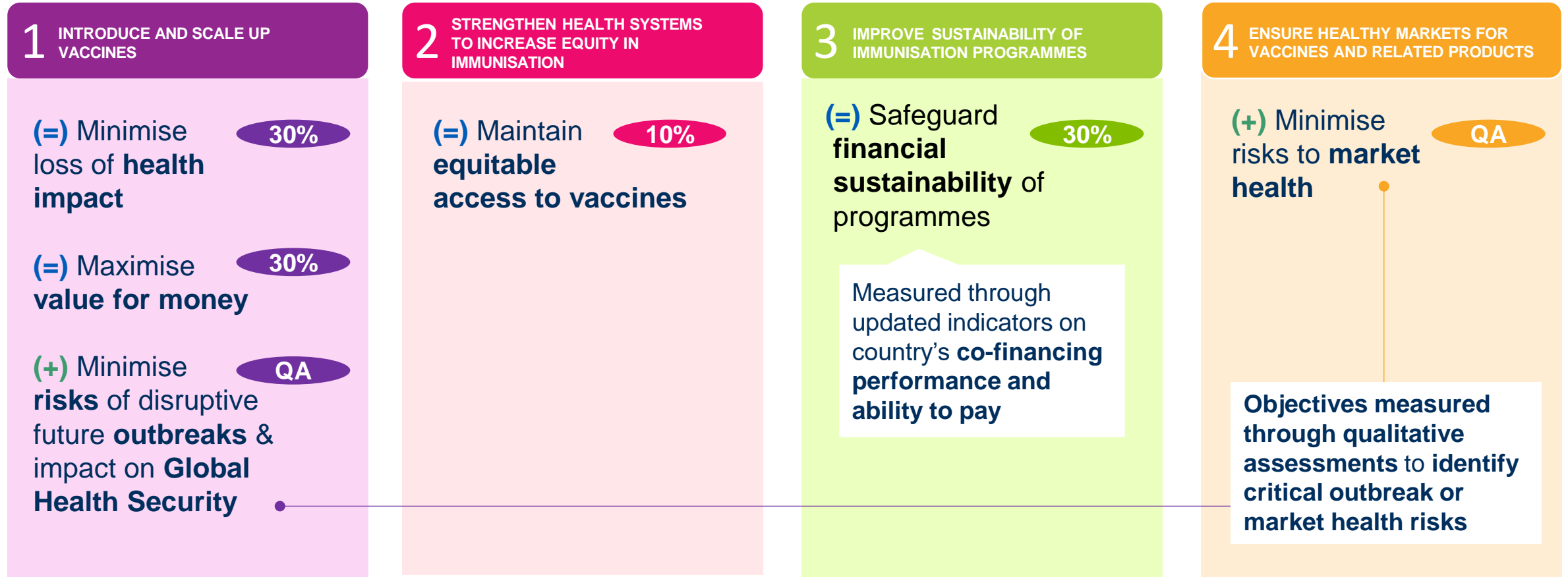
# The existing Board-approved prioritisation mechanism has been updated to ensure it stays fit for purpose in Gavi 5.1

**Gavi 5.1 mechanism applied after each IRC round with projected demand-resource mismatch**

1. Includes routine introductions, preventive, follow up, catch up campaigns, and vaccine switches that are not mandatory and come at a higher incremental cost to Gavi and their associated cash grants (VIGs & Ops, switch grants), vaccine catalytic support for MICs. Excludes outbreak response

# Deep-dive | Qualitative assessments are used to identify critical risks related to market health or disease outbreaks

## Objective

## Rationale

## Assessment criteria

Minimise risks of disruptive future **outbreaks** & impact on **global health security**

Reflect the **Alliance's commitment** to outbreak **preparedness and response**, including for those more likely to occur due to climate change

- **Global health security risk** (e.g., global disease eradication agenda)
- **Country outbreak risk**
- **Vaccination impact** on disease epidemic potential

Minimise risks to **market health**

Prevent **impacts to vulnerable vaccine markets** in a funding-constrained environment

- Demand Health criteria of the **Healthy Market framework**<sup>1</sup>

**Qualitative assessments are used to identify critical risks related to market health or potential for disease outbreaks linked to the primary ranking of specific country applications**

# Recommendation

The Gavi Alliance Programme and Policy Committee **recommends** to the Gavi Alliance Board that it:

- a) **Approve** the revised update of the ‘Prioritisation Mechanism for Gavi’s Support to Countries’ attached as Annex A to Doc 10, as amended by the discussions at the PPC;
- b) **Note** that the Secretariat will propose further revisions to the Mechanism during 2025 to ensure that it is fit for purpose for the Gavi 6.0 strategic period.
